Faye earned her JD *magna cum laude* from Florida State University while simultaneously serving as a military officer in various counter-insurgency environments. Currently assigned to the Joint Staff at the Pentagon as an Africa Regional Strategy Officer, Faye has also practiced law as a civilian attorney, corporate counsel and US state and federal prosecutor. A mother of three, Faye has lived and worked abroad in Europe and Africa. She received the *VICE News "Human of the*

Year" award in 2017, and, in 2019 was recognized by Forbes and Africa Business Daily for her ground-breaking innovation leading projects with government wildlife services throughout Africa.



Jessica Graham serves as the President of JG Global Advisory, LLC. She has previous experience at the U.S. State Department, Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs and INTERPOL Illicit Markets Sub-Directorate, Environmental Security Programme. She is an expert on international policy and non-traditional security threats, including transnational organized crime and wildlife trafficking. Previously she served as a chief negotiator for the U.S. government, and, as part of the former Presidential Task Force for Combating Wildlife Trafficking, Jessica coordinated and implemented USG efforts to strengthen law enforcement responses and develop capacity building and training across Africa, Asia, and Latin America.

Dr. Louise Shelley is the Omer L. and Nancy Hirst Endowed Chair and a University Professor at George Mason University in the Schar School of Policy and Government. She directs the Terrorism, Transnational Crime and Corruption Center (TraCCC) that she founded. Previously, Dr. Shelley ran programs in Russia, Ukraine and Georgia. She served on the Global Agenda Council on Illicit Trade and Organized Crime of the World Economic Forum, was the first co-chair of its Council on Organized Crime, and is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations. Dr. Shelley received her undergraduate degree cum laude from Cornell University, her M.A. in Criminology from the University

of Pennsylvania, and her Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Pennsylvania. She also studied at the Law Faculty of Moscow State University on IREX and Fulbright Fellowships.



Sally Yozell is Senior Fellow and Director of the Environmental Security program at Stimson Center. Yozell also serves in an advisory role to the host governments for the annual global Our Ocean Conference. Previously, Yozell was a Senior Advisor to Secretary of State John Kerry. She has served as Director of Policy and as Deputy Assistant Secretary for Oceans at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration; as a Regional Director for Marine Conservation at The Nature Conservancy; as a Vice President in the applied marine science group at Battelle Memorial Institute; and worked in the U.S. Senate as an environment and energy advisor to Senator John Kerry. Yozell holds

a Master's degree in Public Administration from Harvard University and a Bachelor's degree in Political Science from the University of Vermont.
